Libraries are the nucleus of every educational institution. It opens the doors to the world of books that lie beyond the borders of one's own field of specialization. But in this technology driven era, the internet has replaced books and online learning programs have taken over the traditional classroom environment as well library setups. It has been proven time and again that online books, journals and databases take students to a far wider

world of knowledge and intellectual development. It is indeed heartening to know that the universities in Kerala also are moving in this direction by setting up shareable online resources for everyone who are interested to pursue through the world of knowledge. Needless to reiterate at this point of time that the state government is providing all necessary support to the universities and colleges to augment their libraries and learning

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resources. The University of Calicut has recently set up an impressive system KALNET (Kerala Academic Library Network) which offers a single point access to the entire library resources of Universities in the State. This is designed to offer a single unified catalogue to search for resources across the collections of different academic libraries in Kerala.

We also aware of the role of public libraries outside campuses which act as a centre of public gathering, catalyst of sustaining literacy and a place for cultural development of an area. Beyond that they should also act as extensions to institutional libraries and should provide necessary support mechanisms to people coming out of the campuses and starting their community living in an open world. Keeping in view of this the government has initiated several steps to strengthen small and medium public libraries across the State. In the past five years Kerala State Library Council has given affiliation to 877 new libraries. Balavedi has been started in 2000 libraries and Vanithavedi in 500 libraries. In addition to that taluk libraries and tribal libraries were established and an increase of 60 per cent in the book grant for libraries and over 140 per cent in the monthly allowance of librarians was also allowed. This process will continue in the coming years to achieve the aforesaid objective.

I am of the opinion that the college librarians have to play a vital role in societal development by acting as link pins between the institutional library and public libraries outside the campuses. Their expertise and insight could act as stimulants fulfilling the aim of public libraries.

I request the librarians of the affiliated colleges in the state to dedicate their service for the academic development so as to cope up with the challenging transformation in the field of library and information science.

College Librarians' Association, Kerala, in collaboration with St. Joseph's College for Women, Alappuzha and Kerala State Higher Education Council organized a National Web Conference on 'Technology Integration in Education Research and Libraries' from 25th to 28th August 2020 on Cisco Webex platform. There were four technical sessions on the main theme of the conference. In the first session on 'Technology integration in education, research and libraries' the theme paper was presented by Dr. Ramesh C. Gaur, Dean and Director LIS, Indira Gandhi National Centre for Arts, New Delhi on 25th August. The second session was on 'Technology Applications in Libraries' where topic was presented by Prof. Sadik Batcha, Professor and Librarian i/c, Annamalai University on 26th August. In the third session on 'Scholarly Writing & Publishing: New Methods and Trends', Dr. B T Sampat Kumar, Professor in the Department of PG Studies and Research in Library and Information Science, Tumkur University, presented theme paper on 27th August and in the forth session on 'Digital Skills for Librarianship', Sri. D. P. Thripathi, Assistant Librarian, NIT, Rourkela was the keynote speaker on 28th August.

250 participants registered and participated in the conference from all over India. Eight papers were presented during the conference. CROWDSOURCING IN LIBRARY AND INFORMATION CENTRES

Though 'Crowd sourcing' is an old term, its application in the field of Library and Information Science is comparatively new. It does not yet, have a generally agreed definition.

Crowd sourcing uses social engagement techniques, to help a group of people to achieve a shared, usually significant large goal, by working collaboratively. It usually entails a greater level of effort, time and intellectual input from an individual than just socially engaging. For example, correcting the text of a newspaper article, or transcribing a complete shipping record involves more input than quickly adding a tag to a photograph, or rating a book on a scale of 1-5. Crowd sourcing relies heavily on sustained input from a group of people working towards a common goal (Holley, 2010).

Application in the field of libraries

Many notable examples are available for successful use of crowd sourcing in various fields of information:

- 1. Australian Newspapers Digitisation Program, National Library of Australia: Text Correction. The service was released to users in August 2008 and in November 2009, containing 8.4 million articles to search and correct. The public are enhancing the data by correcting text and adding tags and comments.
- 2. Picture Australia, National Library of Australia: Creation and addition of images. Picture Australia harvests digital images from over 50 cultural heritage institutions both in Australia and overseas. Since January 2006 the public have been encouraged to add their own digital images to Picture Australia via a relationship set up with Flickr. Any of the contributing institutions can then request permission from the public contributors to upload the contributed pictures into their own collections, while the same pictures will remain visible in the central Picture Australia pool.
- 3. Distributed Proofreaders (DP), Project Gutenberg: Creation of EBooks. DP, a non-profit organisation, makes public domain books and journal issues into freely available eBooks. DP was formed in 2000. Volunteers find, scan, OCR and mark up the books themselves, page by page.
- 4. Wikipedia: Creation of digital encyclopaedia; improving personal names authority file at the German National Library; Wikisource. There are several projects at the Wikimedia Foundation. The most well know is the free online encyclopaedia created by the public, Wikipedia.

Benefits to Libraries

Crowd sourcing could bring great benefits to libraries:

- 1. Achieving goals: the library would never have the time, financial or staff resource to achieve on its own.
- 2. Achieving goals in a much faster time frame than what the library might be able to achieve, if it worked on its own.
- 3. Building new virtual communities and user groups.
- 4. Actively involving and engaging the community with the library and its other users and collections.
- 5. Utilising the knowledge, expertise and interest of the community.
- 6. Improving the quality of data/resource (e.g. by text, or catalogue corrections), resulting in more accurate searching.

- 7. Value addition to the data (e.g. by addition of comments, tags, ratings, reviews).
- 8. Gaining first-hand information on user desires and the answers to difficult questions by asking and then listening to the crowd.
- 9. Demonstrating the value and relevance of the library in the community by the high level of public involvement.
- 10. Strengthening and building trust and loyalty of the users to the library. Users do not feel, taken advantage of because libraries are non-profit organisations.
- 11. Encouraging a sense of public ownership and responsibility towards cultural heritage collections, through user's contributions and collaborations.

Volunteers: the back bone of crowd sourcing

The success of crowd sourcing depends on the number of active volunteers who support the project. Wikipedia, Distributed Proofreaders, Australian Newspapers and FamilySearchIndexing all released their services 'quietly' with little or no advertising, but with clear group goals. All had fewer than 4000 volunteers in their first year. These figures rose dramatically in subsequent years as the communities passed the word on and viral marketing (i.e. hearing of the project by blogs, forums, e-mail) took place.

Conclusion

The factors that motivate digital volunteers are not quite different from that, which motivates anyone with the intentions like a) Affection to a particular field b) Eager to learn new things c) Social commitment d) Wish to support to achieve a goal etc.. People spend hours on a particular task because of various motivational factors. Crowd sourcing in libraries is nothing but channelizing this type of motivational factors for achievement of various goals related to the library with the help of Internet technology.

KERALA ACADEMIC LIBRARY NETWORK (KALNET): A SHARED PLATFORM FOR ACADEMIC RESOURCES OF LIBRARIES IN KERALA



Universities in Kerala have developed a rich collection of library resources over the past several decades. These resources are spread across various academic libraries in Kerala. It would be difficult for a user to visit the library catalogues of different universities separately to locate this information for research purposes. Higher education council has come up with a solution to make this task easier by implementing a discovery service to enable single point access to the entire library resources of universities in Kerala called KALNET (Kerala Academic Library Network). Based on the VuFind open source software, a team of library staff from Calicut University has implemented this new generation search interface. Library data from various university libraries are combined to form a single interface which is not only fast but has many advanced features.

Important features

- A single, unified catalog to search for items across the collections of different academic libraries in Kerala.
- Quick searching based on Title, Subject, Author, etc.
- Better integration of the Library's traditional print materials, electronic and digital collections.
- In addition to books, other library resources such as journals/periodicals, PhD theses, Postgraduate dissertations, Daisy Digital talking books (audio books) and various reports are also indexed.

- Advanced searching with Boolean operators and limits for more precise results, as well as a "Narrow Search" feature to limit, sort and refine search results.
- A Virtual Browse feature for print books to see what's related to the book by subject area.
- When viewing a record, the user will be offered suggestions of resources that are similar to the current resource.



Unlike traditional library catalogue, the open source based search interface offers various features like spelling suggestions, auto completion of queries. The main advantage of this search facility is the easiness of a single interface to search resources spread across 147 libraries in universities in Kerala. Recommendation of related topics and similar search helps users locate apt contents. Vufind software is capable of integrating various resources and the higher education council of Kerala plans to provide live status of the availability of the library materials in the second phase.



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
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'Sahitya Charcha'




Head, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Kerala on 'Research contributions of universities of Kerala in the field of humanities.'




eager to use them for their works. Altogether 96 participants, consisting of research scholars, faculty members, librarians and students attended the session.




